## **ARRA Recipient Reporting to End on February 1, 2014**

WASHINGTON – The enactment of the Federal Government’s Fiscal Year 2014 Omnibus Spending bill brings an end to the “1512” Recipient Reporting requirements of the American Reinvestment and Recovery Act (ARRA). Section 627 of the Omnibus repeals the reporting as of February 1, 2014.

Recipients and agencies are currently finalizing recipient reports for Quarter 4, 2013. Data from these reports will be posted on [Recovery.gov](http://Recovery.gov) by the Recovery Accountability and Transparency Board (Recovery Board) on January 30th.

The Recovery Board is working in collaboration with the Office of Management and Budget to develop a process for recipients and agencies to review reports and make final corrections where needed. Details about this process will be disseminated as soon as possible to states and all recipients.

The Recovery Accountability and Transparency Board was created by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 to oversee the expenditure of Recovery funds and bring transparency and accountability to the process. The Board consists of a Chair, Kathleen Tighe, and 12 federal Inspectors General. The Board runs the [Recovery.gov](http://Recovery.gov) website that provides information on the Recovery initiatives, as well as information on the Board’s oversight activities, and spearheads an accountability effort that involves federal investigators, auditors and enforcement officials.
